NEWS FROM THE STATES

Since the last edition, many readers have asked for an explanation of the format that the PBA use in their Tourneys; An elimination round of 24 games is bowled, with pinfall deciding the 16 bowlers who take part in the 1 game round robin plus position round. In this second stage, 50 bonus pins are awarded to the victor of each match, which together with the pinfall determines the 5 finalists. The bowler in 5th place plays the 4th and the winner goes on to play the bowler in third, the winner of which then plays 2nd place and the winner of this match takes part in the Grand final against the Bowler who was in 1st position after the Round Robin.

Hoping this gives more insight, we continue match results on the PBA tour.
DENVER, COLORADO: After the 40 game total BILLY HARDWICK headed the list with RITGER, TOUNTAS, DURBIN and SEMIZ just behind him. TEATA SEMIZ disposed of MIKE DURBIN 212-180, PETE TOUNTAS 194-199 and DICK RITGER 205-172 to join HARDWICK in the battle for 1st place. They were nip and tuck in the early going, then SEMIZ blew a 10 pin in the 7th while HARDWICK left a 5-7 split. That knotted the pair a 134-134, and SEMIZ drilled home a double to take the lead. HARDWICK, fighting desperately, doubled in the 10th frame, then lost count when he left the 1,2,4 on his last ball, giving him a 20 game. SEMIZ needed only to spare to win the title but an 8-10 split left him with the 2nd spot to HARDWICK. Local boy JERRY McCLARY proved that home lanes help by bowling a perfect game, but could only finish in 16th place.

KANSAS CITY, MO: BOBBY COOPER started a chain reaction when he threw a 300 with his 1st game of the Tourney, and during the remainder of the event 5 others joined the act, RAY BLUTH, EDDY PATTERSON, WAYNE ZAHN, ROGER FINK and DICK BATTISTA, this equaled the PBA record of six 300 games in one Tournament at Albany New York in 1960. ROGER FINK also did some high shooting in the final 2 six game blocks of the qualifying round with scores of 1493 and 1406 but could only manage to finish 16th. High scoring was the order of things as after the 40 game qualifying rounds, DON JOHNSON held the lead with a 232 average, DON GLOVER and DAVE SOUTAR (231) BILLY HARDWICK (226) and NELSON BURTON Jr (225) joining him in the Finals. HARDWICK beat BURTON 277-257 and SOUTAR 233-214, then found himself having to bury three strikes in the 10th frame to tie 224-224 with DON GLOVER. In the 2 frame roll off, GLOVER led with a strike, HARDWICK started with a spare then threw a 6,7,10 split, taking only two pins. GLOVER popped the 2nd strike which gave him a shot at DON JOHNSON for the Title. JOHNSON opened with 4 strikes and a spare. GLOVER started spare, strike, spare and 4 strikes in a row to pass JOHNSON who had a 3,10 split in the 6th. From there GLOVER when on to win 245-212.

THE RUNAWAY BALL: In the lobby of the Park Lanes, Charlotte, Nth Carolina. Miss ANNE PLEMMONS was practising her approach, just going through the motions without releasing the ball, when all of a sudden by mistake she let it go. The ball began rolling towards a plate glass door. She gave chase. It smashed through the door. She kept after it. It rolled across a porch overlooking a parking lot. She followed. Then it disappeared. She heard a loud double thump. When she reached the edge of the porch she saw a new Lincoln Continental 10 ft. below with two dents in the hood, and off in the distance the ball was still rolling. The car's owner advised her that his insurance did not cover damage from a falling bowling ball, and the lanes owner said the policy on his door left \$75 to be paid by the kegler. Miss Plemmons says that she has not given up bowling but it seems likely that her game will suffer. For a while she may find it very difficult to let go of the ball. - Sports Illustrated

BTBA County Championships

The National B.T.B.A. County Championships will be held on a Regional Basis over the months of May, June, July and August, with the Grand Final by October.

The Regional Qualifiers will be decided by groups of counties playing off 4 or 5 county team Leagues to determine a winning county men and ladies team to go forward to the Grand Final.

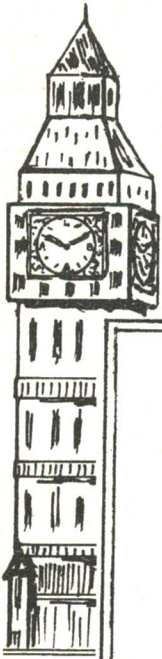
