ERIC BUTCHER London's Pride

ERIC BUTCHER became the pride of London Bowlers over the Bank Holiday Week-end, when he brought the London International Match Play Trophy back to the Capital. Quiet spoken, likeable, family man, Eric, who takes his bowling seriously enough to travel 60 miles each of the two occasions he bowles on Leagues per week at Wembley and North Harrow, was due on Sunday afternoon to prepare for the removal of his home to a place nearer to his bowling, so did not really fancy his chance of survival in the arduous Match Play challenge. Never-the-less he won by the shortest route of eight matches, never being defeated.

this was taken away from its birthplace of Manchester, who won through from the Losers Bracket, getting her revenge on Audrey TEW, who put her into that category from the Final of the Winners Bracket. London have been unable to find a girl to re-capture this title since Rhoda BREWER held it in 1964.

In the Junior divisions, both the Boys and the Girls Titles stay in London, being claimed by DAVID FIELD from Crawley for the boys, and ANGELA SZKUTNIC of Hoddesdon for the girls.

This year in particular, is one that is really going to matter to all those who enjoy this game as either one of, or, their particular sport.

During the past year, too many Centres have had to close, mainly through lack of support, now in London, we have the first closing of one of our Centres, that of ACTON. Although ABC tell us that this closing has only come about because of considerably favourable offer for the premises that housed that Centre, and not because of the house running at a loss. The fact still remains that unless Bowlers band themselves together and show a consolidated effort to keep the sport alive and encourage new bowlers to their ranks, Tenpin Bowling is never going to make the proper place that this family sport should be entitled to.

In London, it is obvious that where the Player Association is flourishing so too, does that Centre enjoy good business, therefore let us hope that this year will see even more Members for the L.A.B.A., and a much higher lineage figure for the Centres.

The Proprietors are without doubt only too willing to make it big, they will be doing their part, please be sure you are going to do yours establish your Leagues, encourage new blood into the game, this year means everything to the Bowling World, it is up to you personally to help keep this sport of ours alive and the Centres that we need for that end, a worthwhile proposition for the investment made by the Proprietors.

BLUE RIBAND CLASSIFIED

It is time once again for this Tournament, especially formulated for the ordinary Bowler of the London Area.

To be staged for the third year, it can now be claimed to have established itself. The 'Snags' of qualifying rounds having been learned by the Tournament Committee, and, we hope, this year, ironed out.

The Finals will be, as before, at NORTH HARROW, on the 14th Dec., and will be for 32 Bowlers in each Section, playing Match Play Elimination until a Champion is found in each Division.

Qualification for the Finals, this year, will take place at SIX Centres, and the percentage of qualifiers will be allocated to each venue, in accordance with the overall entry in each section. i.e.... Say 64 entries are received, overall, in the Standard Division, then the % will be 50%, as only 32 will be required at the Final, therefore each qualifying Centre will forward half of its entrants in that Division to the Final.

We feel, however, that it is not idle boasting when he remarks that he is determined to make WINDSOR LANES the No. 1. Brunswick Centre in the country for open, League and Tournament play establishing at the same time a friendly, well maintained centre providing the very best in the sport of Tenpin Bowling.

F. I. Q.

The Zone Congress of the F.I.Q. was recently held in Copenhagen at the time of the European Championships, and was followed by the World Congress at Mama, Roumania.

Among the many points of discussion, the following was agreed.

1. Players participating in International Tournaments, must be in possession of a letter of authority granting them permission to take part, by their National Association. Persons not in possession of such a letter will not be permitted to participate.
2. An attempt to bring Tenpin Bowling into line with the amateur rules of the International Olympics Committee was defeated.
3. The format of the Emilio de Miguel Championships has been changed, and now calls for a five man team and one substitute. The event will be played over one week end, probably in France (Besancon) and will be decided by each of 16 national teams playing one game against each other on different lanes.
4. The venue for the next World Championships is to be Milwaukee U.S.A. August 1971, and Gt. Britain has been invited to repeat the organisation which resulted in a memorable trip to Mexico in 1963.
5. The venue for the next European Championships will be Vienna 1973.
6. The following countries were officially accepted into F.I.Q. Israel, Panama, Hong Kong, Philipines and Ecuador.
7. As of the 1st January 1970 a fee for sanctioning tournaments will be applied by the European Zone of F.I.Q. Tournaments sponsored, or operated by Commercial parties will be required to pay 50 dollars U.S., and Clubs, Associations etc., will be required to pay a fee of 10 dollars U.S.

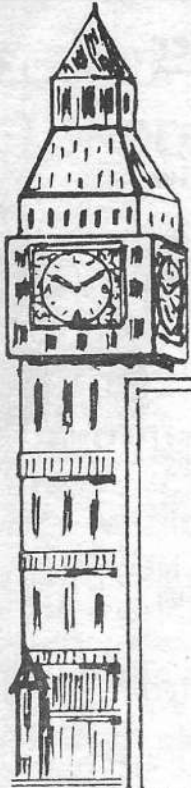

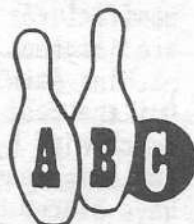
