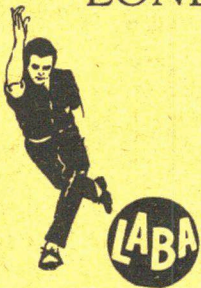

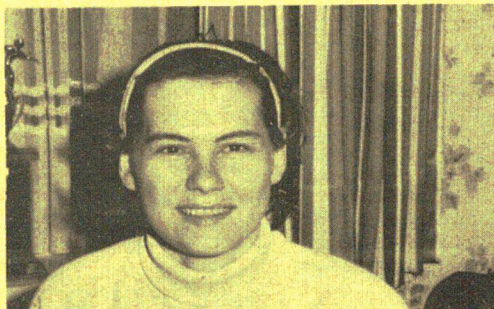

Wembley Bowlers take Singles Titles

Wembley All Stars' 20yr. old PHIL RUSSELL hitting the high game of the tournament of 265 made an eight game total of 1643 giving him a personal average of 205.3 on the first squad of the week-end, made him this years London and Open Scratch Men's Champion. Batchelor Phil, is a Philatelic Dealer (a stamp salesman) and lives in Wembley. He learned his bowling at Wembley as a Junior in 1965 when he broke the house record as a Junior whilst bowling with his father who is his No. 1 supporter, with a 725 series. He was at one time employed by the Stadium as a junior mechanic. He has featured in the prize lists in several London Tournaments including the Match Play, and was the 1969 BTBA Masters Champion at Sheffield.



Wembley Lionesses latest acquisition, MARGE ILAS, took both the Open and the London Area Ladies Scratch Singles Titles at Wembley Bowl on Saturday, 23rd January when she rolled a 185 average over eight games for her 1483 total. Marge, who is the wife of U.S. Serviceman FRED ILAS was born in Detroit Michigan, and is the mother to a two year old baby girl, has been in this country for 19 months, although she has bowled for 10yrs. since she was at high school. She was in the US Forces (WAVES) for 3 yrs. where she took part in a US Navy Bowling Tour of the States. A completely self-taught bowler, who is a good pistol shot, and a keen fisherwoman, bowls at Wembley on three leagues a week, and will be going back to the States in June 1972, hoping to settle in Florida, as Fred will be retiring from the Forces, having done two spells in this country. They look like finishing up in the Racecourse business as Fred's sister owns 13 race horses over there.

B.T.B.A. and T.B.P.A. CLASSIC DOUBLES

The first ever joint BTBA-TBPA Tournament was held at Nth. Harrow on Sunday 3rd January, 1971. Format was decided as being a Doubles, and most of the top scratch male bowlers were entered, although it was apparent that some of the usual faces were conspicuous by their absence. The ladies had a very poor entry, particularly in the handicap section, which catered for bowlers under 150 average. It would seem that the format lost the large proportion of lady tournament bowlers in the 151 to 165 bracket, who could be excused for thinking that they had little chance against the 175 + girls on a scratch basis.

As an annual event, this may need a bit more thought, firstly on the date, being the first week-end after Christmas and within a couple of days of New Year and secondly in relation to the handicap cut-off figure.

The tournament however produced some great bowling figures. Eleven bowlers hitting above a 200 average over their 6 games.

One hundred and ninety two games of 200 and over were rolled, 52 of them above 220. 31 bowlers hit over 600 on a 3 game set, highest of these being D. McCARTHY with 699 - L. GASTON 695 and J. BREWER 690.

Match Play Champion TOM WOOTON hit a 682 together with a 620, made a 1302 block, and with JON REEVES 1215 made up the 2517 total that made the great win for the Harry Stiller Racers, followed some hundred pins behind by Stable companions BERNIE CATERER & CHRIS BUCK, LES SHER & D. McCARTHY followed behind in 3rd place. The Ladies scratch section also produced some great bowling, HELEN DIXON starting the fashion with a great 585 series followed by 580 to give her a personal average of 194 but her partner BERTHA HILL was unable to hit big with her on this occasion and it was left to LILLY BENNETT & CAROLE COLLIER entering with a Slough location tag, to set a 2154 score to head the Ladies scratch list, with Internationals JANET MORRISON and ANN GARRETT now getting known gradually under her married name of ANN THORPE to get the closest to the top pair, mainly with Ann's great six game series of 1166

In the Ladies handicap section it was nice to see those two up and coming bowlers LINDA WAKER and IRIS YOUNG from Hoddesdon lead the shockingly small field of contestants in this division. M. HANDS and R. HILLS of Bexley Heath managed to hold off the Bristol pairing of A. QUICK and P. CRATHORNE by 23 pins with their 2307 inc. handicap to win the mens handicap section.

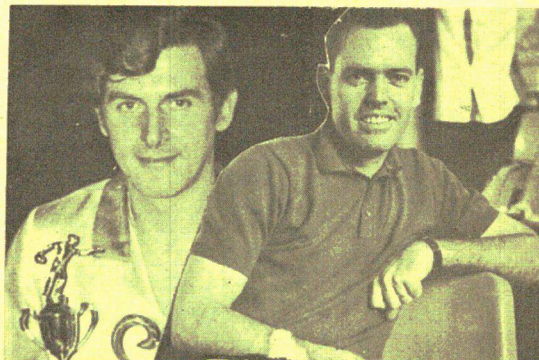

NEWS FROM THE STATES

Bowling has produced some remarkable individuals, who have in turn produced some remarkable bowling. For example, Elvin Mesger of Sullivan, Mo. bowled eight 300 games in one season and 22 perfect games overall. Professional Jim Stefanich, once bowled 40 consecutive 200 games in a tournament.

John Sabo, of Detroit owns a record string of 47 consecutive 600 plus series while bowling in seven leagues during the 1954 season, his string ended with a 592, but he recovered and rolled another set of eight 600's. Nelson Burton Jnr, of St Louis bowled twelve straight 700 series and Arlo Heiland a incredible 72 series of 700 or better in thirteen leagues during the 1962/3 season, eleven more of them than was rolled by Mel Zirzow during 1967/8.

Tom Zayakos of Dayton, Ohio once completed an entire season with only one error while compiling ave of 214, during 1925/6 season, although he did have several splits, and Skang Mercurio of Cleveland in 1929, bowled 65 games in a match without an error.

The vast majority of bowlers are not nearly so fortunate, there are a select few who have found misery on a particular night. Bud Mathieson of Ocean Beach, Calif, fouled 37 times one night and Don Wickenhouse rolled the lowest league game on record when he posted a 7. Wickenhouse set several records that fateful night - most gutter balls in a single game, 18, and most consecutive gutter ball throws, 10. However 'Poodle' Nelson owns the season record for most league gutter balls, with 89 for the 1895/6 season. The record low total with nine strikes - 185, belongs to Bob Fredrickson and was later tied by James Weller.

An interesting scoresheet shows Tom Trynoski's eight strikes only making a 167 game, while two team mates during the same game managed six strikes each and recorded games of 231 and 232, and to complete the misery, another teammate matched his 167- with only one strike.

The above records are extremes, as most records are, and there are many more.

ROGER TAKES TITLE

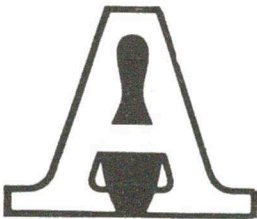
IN RECORD HOLDERS FINAL

Ambassador Record Holders converged on Hounslow Lanes on the week-end of 6/7th December to compete in the Club's tournament. This event saw the first outing of the short-listed men for the Great Britain team for the World Tenpin Bowling Championships in Milwaukee. The most exciting squad came when these men were bowling. The sixth round saw all eyes switch to lanes 11/12 where CLIVE THOMAS had accrued a string of strikes for nine in a row. Came the tenth frame, sudden hush descended as Clive went up to roll his tenth ball and loud cheers as all the pins went flying. Two more balls to go for a perfect game and this time Clive delivered a perfect Brooklyn strike ball which cleared the deck of pins. On the final ball, Clive tried to correct his ball back to the 1 - 3 pocket and, in doing so, went too high on the headpin leaving the No. 6 pin standing solid. Congratulations came from fellow bowlers as he became the first person in the centre to roll a "sanctioned" 299 game "unsanctioned" being rolled by Metropolitan League Bowler, ROY MARTIN two years ago.

At the end of Saturday's squads, CLIVE THOMAS went into the lead by one pin (1627 pins) ahead of LES SHER, but on Sunday afternoon, Portsmouth's ROGER CREAMER seemed determined to show the selectors that he should be considered too for the Great Britain squad. Rogers devastating form produced a 1659 pinfall which helped him snatch the lead and keep it through the remaining squads. His games were 210/242/179/213/193/199/209/214 averaging 207.3 pins over the eight games.

In the Ladies Division, Hounslow's LESLEY POTTER, rolling a 1073 pinfall went into the lead on Saturday and came close to being beaten by British International, EUNICE GRANT and Hemel Hempstead's, HELEN DIXON, who were one pin below.

He was bowling with the newly formed team of HALCYONS from North Harrow, this being their first major outing. Bill was born in Newton, Iowa, and has been bowling only 4 years, has previously hit a 279 with high series of 675. He had a short spell with the Harry Stiller Racers set up.

On behalf of Members of the Major City Scratch League, and upon request of Messrs. Lester and Russell (Solicitors) acting on behalf of J.Rev we publish the following:

We, Bernard Pincus of 1, Mount Grove, Edgware, Middlesex, Eric Butcher of 69 Haylands Way, Bedford, Joe Michael of 4, Leaside Crescent, London, N.W.1. and Helen Olrog of 7, Woodscott Avenue, London, N.W.7. on behalf of ourselves and all other members of the Board of Directors of the Major City Scratch Bowling League hereby unreservedly withdraw all imputations made by any of us upon the character and conduct of Javier Revuelta otherwise John Rev of Caprice Flambard Road, Parkstone, Poole, Dorset and any other members of the Harry Stiller Racers prior to or consequent upon their expulsion from the Major City Scratch Bowling League on the 21st day of April, 1969 and we acknowledge that there was no foundation for any of the allegations made against them nor justification for their expulsion and we hereby collectively and individually apologise to the said Javier Revuelta otherwise John Rev and other members of the Harry Stiller Racers for our actions and their consequences.

4th BLUE RIBAND CLASSIFIED

The fourth Blue Riband Classified Tournament was brought to its conclusion on December 13th, 1970, when the 32 finalists of each of the four divisions, battled away through the matchplay format to arrive at the four winners.

This years championship, the largest ever, with 306 original entries taking part in the qualifying rounds, forces the LABA committee to take a serious look at a change in format, to accomodate the ever increasing number of entries and consider a larger number of bowlers in the finals.

Thanks must go to ABC Bowl, North Harrow and Manager Paul Graves, for the wonderfull co-operation that was given again this year and the little touches, such as welcoming banners and bar entertainment which go to make this tournament so pleasant to take part in.

The bowling standard was high and the tone of the tourney was set in the very first game, when executive member BILL WALBY, taking part in the Major division, amazed himself and the spectators with a 265 game, and this standard was cemented by RON BUDGEN in the Supreme division only two squads later with a 663 series.



STANDARD (146-155 Average)

The Americans really took over this division with 13 year old RICHARD PONCHERI, the son of a serviceman, shooting a 178 average over the 15 games, and defeating serviceman WILKIE JERNIGAN in the final.

RICHARD was never seriously worried as he ran through opponents, STEPHEN McLEAN, PENNY BASS, PAT HEARNE and ANDREW JONES with at least a 50 pin margin.

After defeating JULIE HOWES 542-506, WILKIE had a scare from GEORGE PLUMRIDGE before going through 486-485, then went on to take care of ALAN SMITH 540-461 and DAVID TUCKER 552-515.

In the final, Richard went into an 8 pin lead but after the second Wilkie was 23 pins up, but in the last game he slipped and allowed Richard through again for a 524-493 win.

BANTAM (Up to 145 average)

Although averagewise this was the lowest division, the scores and enthusiasm made nonsense of the entry figures. ARLENE JERNIGAN and JOHN PHELAN gave a spirited performance with John eventually taking the title.

After disposing of CHAS McKIBBIN 475-456 and SUSAN PUGH 521-418, ARLENE ran up against DIANE FIELD and a split in Diane's final frame gave Arlene a 1 pin victory 474-473, and a semi-final date with JILL ANDERSON which resulted in another victory 501-469.

JOHN had a seemingly unspectacular route via PAT TARGETT 459-411, MARGARET ONYETT 427-408, EDMUND PAGE 477-417, and MIKE BORE 441-402.

In the final John gained an early lead of 28 pins and increased this to 46 pins after the second game before slipping slightly to win 526-485.

SUPREME (166-180 Average)

Both of the finalists, BILL McCARTNEY of Lewisham and the eventual winner BILL BALDERSON, Crawley, made heavy weather of the early rounds.

After disposing of BOB CLIFFORDE by 55 pins, BILL BALDERSON found himself in desperate trouble against ALAN COUCH and with only 7 frames left was 59 pins down, but fired seven strikes in a row to win 553-536, only to find himself in trouble again in the next round to RON BUDGEN, but this time a four bagger was enough to give a 569-542 victory.

GEORGE BUTTERFIELD left his recovery too late in the semi-final and went down 534-567. BILL McCARTNEY must still be having nightmares about his 1st round match against MARTIN BANKS, who led by 54 pins going into the last game but let Bill off the hook. IAN HAYDON must have thought he was through till Bill finished with 5 strikes in a row to win 538-531, then a 219 final game gave him the edge over ROBIN SKINNER 579-489 and he disposed of TIM BALDWIN 528-489 in the semi-final.

In the final BILL BALDERSON was 8 pins down after the first, but turned that into a 17 pin lead after two and eventually won 531-517.

MAJOR (156-165 Average)

After an all Tolworth final, JOHN GREENWOOD must be wondering why he saved his lowest series of the day for the finals, allowing JAN SHIPP to take the title.

Johns only difficult match occurred in the first round when he had to find a 214 last game to defeat last years losing finalist DOUG ASHTON 531-513, After this John banished DAVE BASCOMBE, B. CORETTE and ARTHUR LEWERY with relative comfort.

JAN was having to struggle her way through and after a comfortable win over executive member JACK SYKES 558-477, she defeated TERRY CHAPPLE 488-480, ERNIE JERMY 452-441 and DON WILLIS 577-528.

The final was a topsy turvy affair in which JAN was ahead by 1 pin after the first, but found herself 11 down after the second. Then the last game saw JOHN disintegrate spectacularly for Jan to eventually win 487-474.

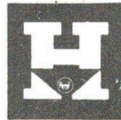
