## NEWS FROM THE STATES

The Professional Bowlers Associatoin (PBA) are saluting a new 'Shooting - Star' - Johnny Petraglia from Brooklyn, N.Y. This Twenty-four year old Southpaw has shattered the single season Tournament earnings record, set by Jim Stefanich only four years ago, with a new mark of \$70,928 from the first eighteen tournaments, an average of almost \$4,000 per tournament. There are 20 more Professional tour tournament stops left this year, so the chances are pretty high on him becoming America's first 'thousand tonner'. To acheive this Petraglia has been spilling the pins at a high rate, his first thirteen tournaments meant his bowling 476 games coming out with an average of 214.586. Anyone fancy haveng to bowl almost 40 games each tournament let alone finishing with that sort of average.

Petraglia's finest win was undoubtably the treasured 'Firestone Champion of Champions', at Akron, Ohio, but this seems to have fanned the flames of the hottest argument in bowling at present -

### DO LEFTHANDERS HAVE AN ADVANTAGE OVER RIGHTHANDERS

After Petraglia's winning streak this year his fellow bowlers were saying that he or some other lefthander with credentials just as impressive, might just make all the righthanders on the Pro tour look for more gainful employment.

Their point is that until Dave Davis proved by winning the PBA National Title in 1965, that lefties could beat the righties at their own game, lefthanders were as scarce in topflight bowling circles as they are in golf. Davis is considered the best of the lefties - even the righthanders say that much, but the righties draw the line when, as happened at Akron, four of the five finalists on television were left handers. In Petraglia's two previous wins, there had been three lefties and when he won in Winston-Salem, N.C. he beat fellow southpaw Larry Lichstein in the finale and another lefty, Mike McGrath, to get into the Championship Match. The one nobody forgets is the San Jose Open in February, when all 16 finalists were lefthanders.

Of course the righthanders dont say much when a month later in Toledo, the highest finishing lefty was Petraglia in 34th place.

Dick Weber, past President of PBA, felt so strongly at Akron that he and Nelson Burton, Jr, 1970 Bowler of the year, bowled their final game of the position round with Back-up deliveries from the left side. Weber won 201 - 109, leaving some spectators saying that he should have started the new style sooner. Burton threw lefthanded at several wide splits and once at a full set. Both bowlers were reported to the PBA for their behaviour and fined.

A committee representing the National Bowling Council has been studying the lane conditioning situation, which in simple terms amounts to the preponderance of right handers developing a track or glazed ball path on their side of the lane, a condition that lefties dont have because there are fewer of them on their side. The lefty it is claimed, has more area in which to "move his ball around." The righty, they say, doesn't have this latitude. His line might change within one game.

So the battle rages and we will keep you informed of any further developements.



### SLOUGH

News is to hand as we go to press that the independently owned Centre of Windsor Lanes Slough, has closed its doors. If this is the case we assume that the ROY WINKLEMAN organisation will still keep the popular Mokingham Centre under his flag, as we understand that many additions such as Squash Courts, Gymnasium, Showers and Dressing Rooms are planned for the future.

## WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

MILWAUKEE: Ask most bowlers what they know about this strange named American city and most will associate it with that advert in most Bowl bars, about a beer that it was made famous by. The more knowledgable will recognise that it is the home of the American Bowling Congress (ABC), but this August it will become the Hot-Bed of Tenpin Bowling when the 7th Federation Internationale des Quilleurs (FIQ) World Bowling Championship is held at the Milwaukee Arena.

The twenty-eight lanes on which the Championships will be decided are being supplied and installed especially for this event, with A.M.F International equipping the sixteen lanes on which the Men will bowl, and Brunswick Corp. the Ladies twelve. The spreads will be separated by a sixteen feet wide aisle down which the competitors will be paraded carrying National flags and led by a marching band, giving an Olympic type opening to the Championships.

At the awards ceremonies, Champions will be called to the podium to receive their medals and a band will salute the first, second and third, playing their respective National Anthems.

The leading amateurs from around thirty countries will be vying for the titles in Eight-man, Five-man, Five-woman, Four-women, Doubles, Singles and Individual 'All-Events' competitions. Matters are further complicated by the fact that part of the proceedings are bowled "European style - One lane" and the remainder in what is to us conventional "American style".

Great Britain will be defending two titles, namely the Doubles (Less Morley-Dave Pond) and Individual All-Events (Dave Pond) which were won in 1967 at Malmo, Sweden, and although neither Morley or Pond will be in the team this time, we are sure that the Men and Women who represent us this time will be trying their utmost to surpass our triumphs last time.

The conditioning is over, both of our teams have recently returned from trips to the States where they gained valuable experience of lane conditions, and all are used to bowling under the strains that prevail at the high International level. August is the time when this will be put to the test.

The teams will be having final practise outings in July at: Worthing, 10th. Bitterne, 11th. Hoddesdon, 17th. Stevenage, 18th. Dagenham, 23rd. and Wembley 24th. so why not go along and give them your support.

We are sure that you would wish them well and know that our "Ambassadors of British Bowling" wont just be going - for the beer that made Milwaukee famous.

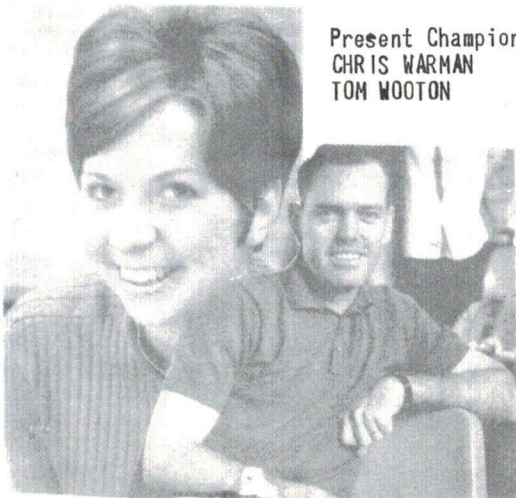
## LONDON MATCH PLAY

This year's qualifying rounds amount to 13 once again. The now established format will be followed with the percentage of qualifiers allocated to each Centre in accordance with the number of entries at each Centre in relation to the overall entry. Their opponents in the opening match were host county Hertfordshire, but a home venue did little for them, and an erratic display gave Middlesex a comfortable 8-0 victory, 2816 - 2424 with the notable set being bowled by BERNIE CATERER, 659.

Going into the second match, Essex knew that to have any chance of overhauling the Middlesex team at the final venue, they had to win the match, and showed determination, putting together a 925 game only to find Middlesex winning with a 990, the second game went the same way, 910-929 and Middlesex completed the set with a 974 - 919 to snatch 8 points 2893-2754 and therefore make their home venue a mere formality.

In the other matches Herts beat Suffolk 6-2 and Essex added to Suffolks black day 8-0.

IN THE LADIES DIVISION: Hertfordshire and Middlesex are fighting out who goes to the finals, with the edge going to the latter. Before this round started Middlesex had only a two point lead and the first match brought the teams together.

Middlesex got off to a good start 882-810, but a rally in the second game saw Herts back 844-773, but the Middx. Girls found their line again in the 3rd game to win 873-854 for a 6-2 victory. Middlesex coasted to an 8-0 win over Essex while Hertfordshire dropped a vital 2 points to Suffolk in their second sets.

Everything now hinges on the opening matches at the Airport Bowl on 1st August.
