Three times in seven issues of this publication PHIL RUSSELL has been featured on this front page.

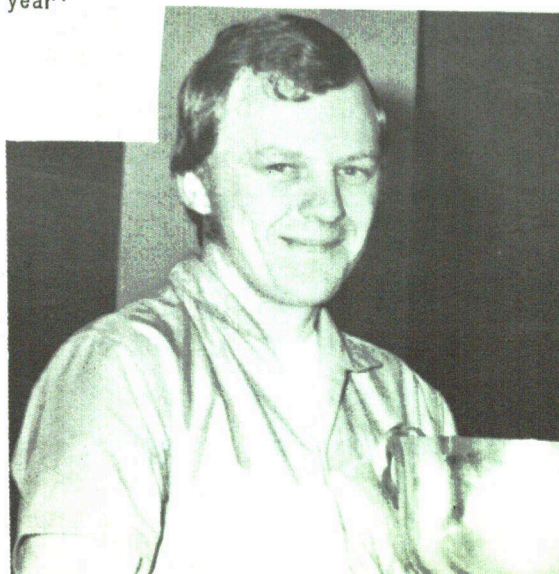

Twice winner of the British National Masters Event - This years winner of the London Open Singles.

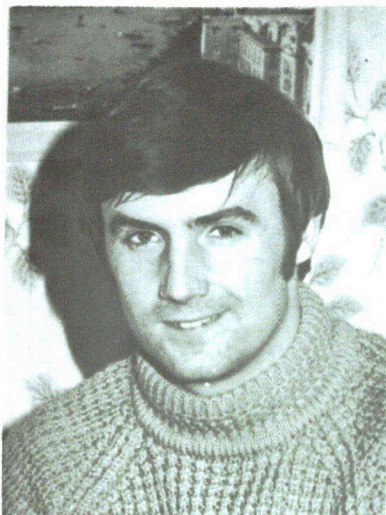

BOOTH'S GIN

BRITISH MASTERS CHAMPIONSHIPS

High scoring, high prize money and a large entry, made this years Booth's Gin Masters Championships held at ABC Bowl, North Harrow on the first two week-ends of October, a feast of the best in British Tenpin Bowling entertainment.

MASTERS CHAMPION

This years championship was obviously going to be a high scoring affair, when during the eight game qualifying round no fewer than 3 bowlers scored a 1700 plus pinfall, led by GEOFF BUCK with a phenomenal tally of 1785 (a 223 average). Sixteenth and last place was shared with a 1601 total, necessitating a three game decider to be bowled in the morning, prior to the finals, between, SAM PUGH from Harrow and the 27 year old USAF Captain, PAUL GRAMMS, which resulted in the final place going to Paul.

The final started in a blaze of high score activity, with last years Master Bowler, COLIN PRESLAND leading the way with a 277 game and seemingly powering his way to a repeat victory. The name PAUL GRAMMS then started making it's presence felt on the leader board as first he drew level and then forged ahead. While the top position was reversing almost every game, BERNIE CATERER, CHRIS and GEOFF BUCK were seemingly content with the next three places, but this was not to be as first DICK JOHANNINGMEIER overtook all of them and hit the top of the leader board and LEN GASTON started making his move.

COLIN PRESLAND then began to lose steam and steadily fell away from the leaders, leaving GRAMMS and JOHANNINGMEIER to fight it out. The 11th, 12th, 13th games saw the emergence of a new name among the leaders as BILL LIGHT crashed in a 754 three game tally and moved into 4th place.

The final position round found GRAMMS in 2nd place 3 points behind JOHANNINGMEIER and needing an 11 pin victory to overtake him and land the £250 prize and coveted title. At the seventh frame GRAMMS had made ten of the pins and a double in the 8/9th frames saw him home 233-211.

Interviewed afterward Paul summed the whole thing up by saying "When I left home at 6.30 this morning, I faced a 200 mile trip, being knocked out in the three game decider and a long trip back, I wondered whether it was worth it - now I'm sure glad I came". To which we add "and so do all of us".

The other events were dominated by a new British - 3 game record of 775 rolled by GEOFF LIDDARD of the Sceptres during the Trios event, with games of 276-223-276 beating the previous high of 772 set by BRIAN WILKINS less than a year ago. GEOFF also added a 202 for a four game total of 977. Team mates ERIC BUTCHER and JOHN DAWSON played their part in giving SCEPTRES I the £70 top prize in the scratch section with a 2556 tally.

Handicap TRIOS went to the GREEN ARROWS team of LEN HAMBLYN, MICK MULVIHILL and DAVE BROWN with a 2517 total including handicap.

The MIXED DOUBLES event was won by Hoddesdon's Junior, ANGELA SZKUTNIK partnered by STAN POND with a 1762 scoreline.

The handicap total of Plymouth's DAVID EVANS took everyone by surprise in the singles event and put paid to the old adage that nobody ever does it from the front, as his 880 scratch total added to a 100 pin handicap set a target of 980, right from the very first squad of the Championships, a figure that was not to be bettered.

After all the high scoring, Harrow's lanesman, LEN GASTON must feel that his hard work was justified.

New Bowling Format

Some concern seems to be evident in the minds of many of those responsible for the staging and organising of tournaments. It is becoming more and more apparent that in tournaments where a 5 man scratch team format is staged, entries are becoming thinner and thinner. Many teams may well not be entering these events as for some time the prize lists have shown the same teams featured over and over again for the top money positions.

The logical progression if this should continue would be only 4 or 5 teams competing in Scratch Team events, which would not only be a stupid situation but would also be bad for the sport, to say nothing about making it almost impossible to see bowlers in action for top team competitions for the purpose of helping in the selection of National Teams.

With this in mind - ABC are to try out a new format for a tournament, and experiment - at the moment with a singles event - a handicap event in reverse.

With the assistance of LANG'S WHISKY they are to hold a Gold Cup Tournament with a guaranteed prize fund of £200 over eight games, bowlers with a 190 and below average will bowl scratch and those holding 191 and above will have a minus handicap equivalent to 2/3rds of a pin for every pin over 190 - so a bowler with a 199 average gets a minus 3 from every game he shoots - a 208 average bowler will lose 6 pins on each game. It is a worthwhile experiment and if successful it would be applied together with any modifications that may be learned during the exercise - to a 5 man team event.

To help things along a conventional Handicap Mixed Doubles event with re-entry of over 4 games will be staged at the same time to keep the whole days experiment flowing, and keep the ladies in the picture.

Club Championships were held on Sunday 26th September and although the entries were not as high as in previous years, the enthusiasm made all the difference.

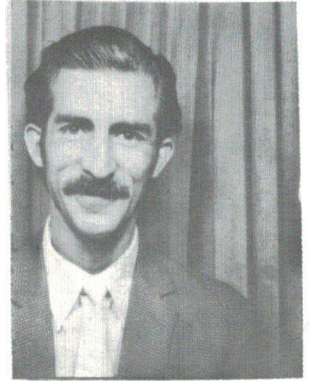
Rolling a 5 game total of 985 ALLEN "ACE" MITCHELL became the singles champion for '71. Second place went to M. BIGGS who rolled 972, with D. BROWN 940 third.

KATE SMITH took most of the Ladies honours being involved in three finals.

Kate and GEORGE BLACKALLER won the Mixed Doubles, and Kate then followed up by winnin the singles with a 5 game total of 805. In winning her third trophy Kate was partnered by BETTY STAPLEHURST and MARY PARKES.

The men's final provided an entertaining and exciting climax to the afternoon with the result in doubt until the last frame. BOWLRITE STARS eventually won by just 31 pins from the GREEN ARROWS bowling team. The final scores being 2746 to 2715

JEAN FERGUSON has provided a full and varied League, and Tournament programme well over forty leagues have already started their winter schedule. One of the main talking points is the Thursday night Pot Games run ably by RON BROCKLESS. One Pot Game is run early in the evening, and then a smaller game later.



CHRIS BUCK who is averaging over 300 in the Thursday Scratch Doubles, takes part and at present seems unbeatable. With two series over 700, and an average of over 220 it is not surprising that the other bowlers are hard pressed to beat him. IAN BRUMMER, GEORGE BLACKALLER, and COLIN BROWN are the other bowlers who make up this quartet. Ian who averages over 915 in the two leagues he rolls in at this centre has just rolled a 278 game, to go with one he rolled at Hounslow in the Metropolitan League. Chris does not have things all his own way, but one of the other bowlers stated that it does improve your average. Small wonder that this Pot Game is so talked about.

INTER-COUNTY CHAMPIONSHIP

The best so far - is the undoubted verdict on this the 3rd Annual Inter Counties Final. In an atmosphere of complete friendliness, this was the year that this tournament established itself, not only as a highlight of the Sports' Calendar Year, but also became the Social Function of the Year. Games were played with keen sporting competition and the Saturday evening function was the talking point of all on the Sunday. All enjoyed themselves and in first class surroundings joined in the festivities with one another, assisted to the end by the superb buffet spread and a group of musicians that had the knack of getting everyone to let their hair down.

The bowling was found to be a lot harder than the socializing - High scoring was found to be a none too easy, but the 'Round-Robin' Format gave the chance for each county to pitch their strength against all the other finalists. The end of Saturdays 4 game session saw ones own Area's hopes of London & Middlesex in both mens and ladies line-ups all with changes with the exception of London Ladies who had lost 3 of the 4 games, winning their only game of the day against Middlesex. London men had dropped one game to Middlesex when they met in game No. 3 - The Middlesex men finished the day with a maximum.

Sunday Pre-lunch 3 game session pointed the way to the eventual winners. In the ladies division Lancs and Cheshire were the only teams who had only lost one game and it became a battle between the two of them, Middlesex ladies dropping a further game against Cheshire in the 8th match by 9 pins and so left Cheshire with a walk over in the last game by virtue of the fact that the Welsh ladies team for the second year running failed to show. It now remained for Lancs to beat London Ladies in the last match to take the Championship on the tie-break pinfall decider and this they did fairly comfortably by over 60 pins and so kept the Silver Pin for yet another year.

The mens division became a three cornered battle between Middlesex, Durham and London which was the order in which they finished. Middlesex dropped a match to Durham on game 5, the first of the Sunday session. This put Durham at the top with London and Middlesex following, and all three counties continued in winning vein until the 8th game when Durham went down to Hants by 969 to 911. This made all three counties level going into the last game with Middlesex some 300 pins in hand on pinfall.

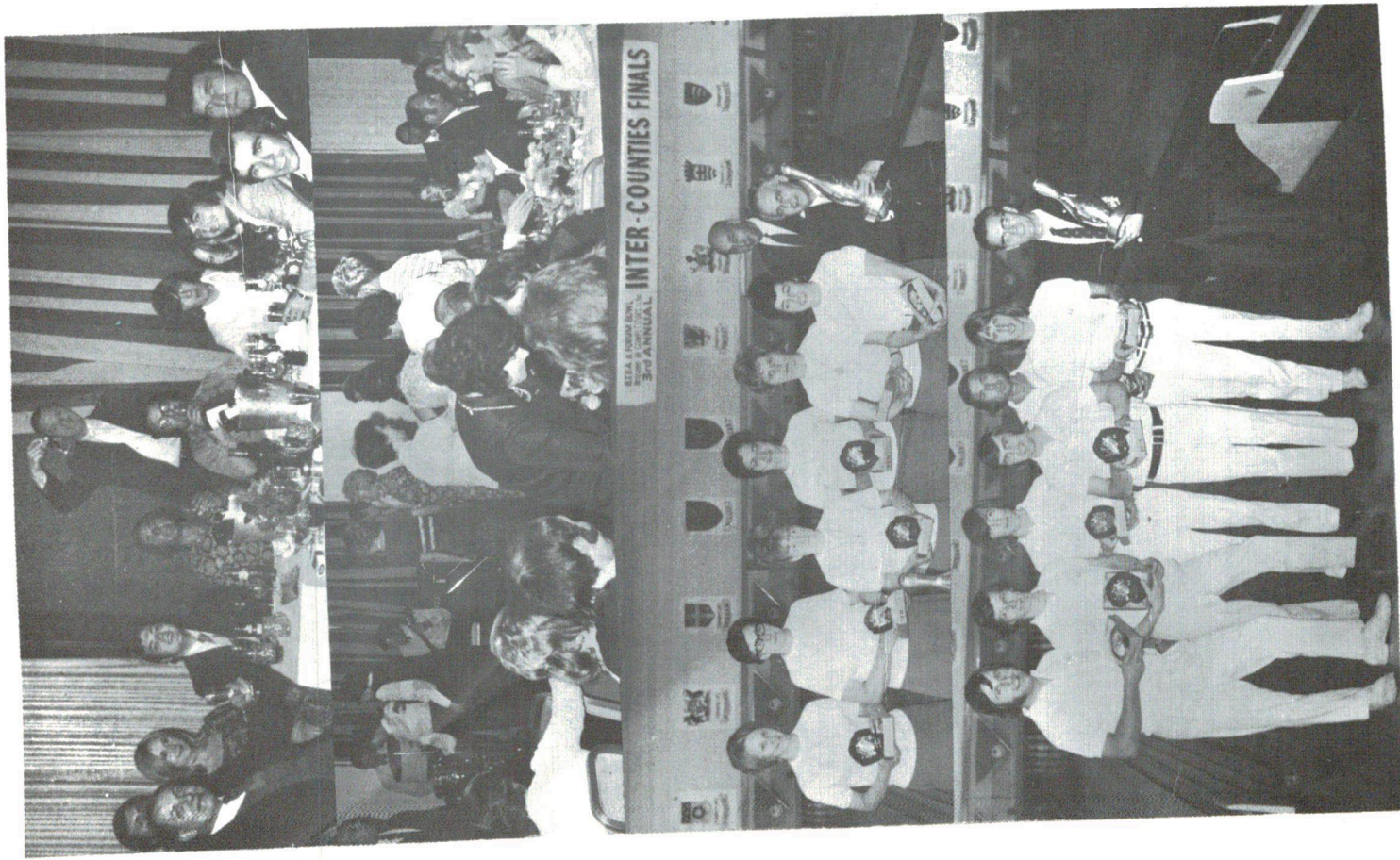
It meant that Middlesex only had to beat Dorset to take the Championship as Durham and Middlesex were playing each other. Durham took the honours out of their battle and so had the satisfaction of beating both the Southern Contenders. Middx made a lonesome run in against Dorset and so brought the Mens Trophy back home to our Area where it was held last year by London.

Showing their expertise in third place were Sussex Ladies 2271. In the scratch doubles the MPAA 'B' Team lead the way with 1080 while Rochester Row attained 1055 for second place and Great Yarmouth 'A' third 1003. In the Handicap division, Hastings surged ahead for 1205 pins and first place although Vine Street 'B' 1195 and MPAA 'B' 1191 were not far behind. The singles event attracted 80 entries with D.C. Saxby, Sussex (574) leading the scratch division with P.C. Hopkins from Brighton (568) in second position and Lancashire's D.C. Crook third 533 pins. In the handicap Saxby's 658. Third place P.C. Nancekieveille of Thames Valley with 1606 pins (178.4 over nine games). The Ladies ALL Events, high game and high series title went to P.C.W. Hazel Lane. In the recent Wenban-Smith Doubles Tournament at Worthing, CHRIS LEAVY and KEITH GREYSTOKE succeeded in setting a new doubles house record game of 500 pins.

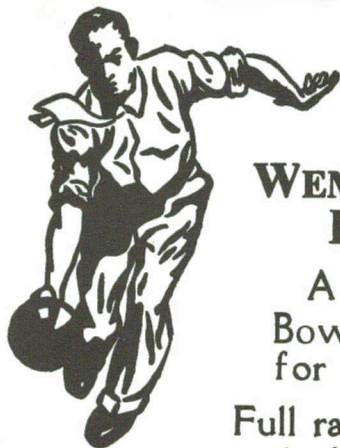
